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Welcome to Barcelona

POLLEN 2026 takes place in a city rich in the work and scholarship of political ecology, where political ecology and political ecologists dwell a diversity of organisations and institutions, and are active in research work, teaching and social movements. As you will see from the constitution of the organising committees, convening this meeting has been a thoroughly collaborative exercise.

Barcelona has a complex relationship to the issues that animate the political ecology community. It is celebrated as the backbone of anti-fascist resistance, the biggest city in Catalonia whose language was once banned and where the wiphala flag, representing the Andean Indigenous Peoples of South America, is often raised in protest during the 12th of October Spanish National Day. What is more, in 2018, the city council removed a statue dedicated to one of Catalonia's foremost slave traders. And yet this is also the city in which a statue of Christopher Columbus sits on a 60m plinth, and which itself headed its own medieval empire across the Mediterranean. And during the last phases of the Spanish Empire, the city accumulated wealth through the slave trade and access to privileged colonial markets, reflected in historical landmarks that are intimately connected with the plantation economy. In the present Barcelona regularly wins design and architectural prizes and leads planning and technical innovation. Meanwhile its residents contest the erosion of public life in plazas, evictions from apartments owned by financial organisations and the social and environmental impacts of mass tourism. We believe that Barcelona's contradictions make it all the more fitting a place to take on the complicated world we seek to understand.

Our theme in the call for proposals, that was written back in 2024, focussed on the stories of political ecology. And in between the drafting of that call and the present conference, the world has become a darker place. The stories we tell and read around us remain as relevant as ever. But we have given a slightly different remit to our plenary speakers. We asked them to focus on the authoritarianisms now proliferating. Analysing them is the focus of the first plenary on Tuesday morning at UAB. Exploring responses to them, and how they might be seen differently, is the task of the second plenary. The format of these plenaries is designed to bring in as much reflection and input from the audience as possible. Our third plenary, at the Maritime Museum on Thursday evening, will try to take stock of some of the things that we have learnt. Again, the event is shaped to include as much reflection and input from the audience as possible.

Around and in between these events are over 250 workshops, panels, walks, film screenings, book launches, games and diverse discussions. This is the largest POLLEN gathering so far - which could be a problem because POLLEN has long been an intimate gathering, and the better for it. But if we shut our doors to all the interest that is growing in political ecology then we could deny its space to people who need it. For POLLEN 2026 the general advisory group advised not to go as large as possible but accepted that some growth was inevitable. The scientific committee accordingly sifted through 230 panel proposals, resulting in 133 panels. In late 2025, panel convenors considered nearly 2000 presentation proposals from over 2500 people, and taking on just over 1400. Accommodating these required a five-day meeting rather than the normal three-days. Your feedback on how this has worked will be vital.

Any meeting like this requires a huge amount of work online answering thousands of emails as well as much on the ground arranging locations, refreshments, entertainment and diverse provisions. POLLEN 2026 would have been impossible without the efforts of Maria Pastor and Dan Brockington from ICTA-UAB and the support of the María de Maeztu Unit of Excellence programme, and without the work of Alix Hargreaves-Brough, Triinu Mets, Carlotta Ottonello, James Howard and their colleagues in NomadIT. Our thanks to them all.
